SCHEDULE CONFIRMATION

Exact daily start times, court allocations and match order are confirmed only after the Official Draw at the Technical Meeting on 4 August. The final Competition Schedule will be distributed to Team Managers and published on the Sportity app — please treat the dates above as the framework for planning travel, and always check Sportity for the live daily schedule.

1. CLASSIFICATION

Classification will take place on the **3rd and 4th August** depending on delegations' time of arrival at Poznań, according to the following schedule:

Important! Please note that we have two Classification Panels on 3rd and 4th June (Panel – A and Panel – B). Classification Room is located on the 1 and 2 Floor.

CLASSIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Athletes must present to classification area 30 minutes before the allocated time on the classification schedule;
- **Documents** - Each athlete to be classified must:
 - Have submitted their updated Certificate of Diagnosis and Consent Form for Classification before the Event by e-mail to World Boccia and bring the original documents to Classification, otherwise they will not be classified;
 - Bring a passport along with his/her accreditation card;
 - Present relevant medical documentation (in English);
 - Attend the Evaluation Session with sports attire and equipment relevant to Boccia, such as ramps, pointers and gloves or splints;
 - Be accompanied by an interpreter if the athlete does not speak English.

- Please **arrive at Equipment Check 5 – 10 minutes prior to your time slot;**
- Equipment that does not meet the criteria will not be certified and will be held by the organisation until the end of the competition;
- At any time, including during a match, the referee may confirm the eligibility of any piece of equipment. Any equipment that fails eligibility during competition will be confiscated for the remainder of the competition.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: All **BC3 Sports Assistants** are required to bring their passport to the equipment check to confirm Nationality eligibility according to the World Boccia Policy – Nationality of Competitors **and it must be from the same country as the athlete.**

TRAINING ON THE COMPETITION COURTS (FOP)

- Teams should be at the entrance of the competition area at least 5 minutes before the scheduled time.
- Five minutes before the finish time, teams must stop training and prepare all the equipment to get out at the scheduled time.
- Access to the entrance of training area will be allowed only to accredited staff or athletes who are scheduled for training.
- During training sessions please keep exclusively to the court(s) that are allocated to your nation and make sure that you don't disturb athletes training on other courts.

COMPETITION

Countries eligible to compete at the Poznań 2026 World Boccia Challenger must have paid all entry fees in full, submitted all required registration information and are currently full members of World Boccia in good standing.

DIVISIONS OF PLAY

Individual BC1, BC2, BC3, BC4 (Male & Female) and Pairs BC3 and BC1-BC2 Teams.

COMPETITION NUMBERS (BIBS)

- Upon confirmation of classification, each athlete shall be given one (1) piece of competitor number, to be used as follows:
 - The BIB must be worn at all times during the hours of competition and must be clearly visible from the front. The competitor number must be affixed on the front of the shirt or the trouser leg or it may be fixed to the wheelchair;
 - For class BC3, the ramp operator will have a second competitor number that must be clearly visible affixed on his/her back (shirt).

If an athlete forgets, loses or chooses not to wear their competitor number, **he/she will not be permitted to enter the Warm-up area, the Call Room or the Field of Play** (Rule 7.3).

- A Side that is not present in the Call Room on time will forfeit the match. (Rule 7.4). Exceptions may be considered by the Head Referee and/or the Technical Delegate.

PRE-GAME PREPARATION

5. WARM UP PROCEDURES

- From the 5th of August on, warm-up area is exclusive for the competitors that are going to play next.
- Players may be accompanied into the warm-up area by a maximum number of people as follows (Rule 6.2):

BC1	1 Coach, plus 1 Sport Assistant
BC2	1 Coach, plus 1 Sport Assistant
BC3	1 Coach, plus 1 Ramp Operator
BC4	1 Coach, plus 1 Sport Assistant
Pairs BC3	1 Coach, plus 1 Ramp Operator per Athlete
Pairs BC4	1 Coach, plus 1 Sport Assistant
Team (BC1-BC2)	1 Coach, plus 1 Sport Assistant

- If necessary, a translator and a physiotherapist/massage therapist per Country may enter the warm-up area, however they can't help or assist with coaching.

WARM UP SCHEDULE (Rule 6.1.1.)

- When the Call Room closes for the last matches of the day, Athletes who did not play during the day may use the Warm Up Area to train for 60 minutes. The TD may adjust this time frame to allow reasonable access to the Warm Up Area and to accommodate the competition schedule.
- An Athlete or side entering the Warm up area out of turn; or bringing to the Warm Up Area, or into the Call Room, more than the allowed personnel (ref.: 6.2, 7.2). This will result in a yellow card for the Athlete or the side in the case of Team or Pair matches. (Rule 16.9.1).

6. CALL ROOM PROCEDURES

- Prior to entering the Call Room, each Athlete and each Ramp Operator must show their competitor bib numbers and their accreditation tag. Coaches and SA must show their accreditation. (Rule 7.3).
- Each Side (Individual, Team or Pair, including any SA/RO and the Coach) must register together and must bring all their equipment and balls with them. (Rule 7.4.2).

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CALL ROOM SCHEDULE (Rule 7.4.1.)

- The Official Clock is the digital clock situated at the entrance of the Call Room. Registration for all matches is done at the Call Room desk, which is at the entrance to the Call Room. A Side that is not present in the Call Room on time will forfeit the match. (Rule 7.4).
- Once registered and inside the Call Room, Athletes, Coaches and SA/RO may not leave the Call Room. Should they do so, they will not be allowed to re-enter and will not take further part in the current match (rule 7.12 is an exception.) Any other exceptions will be considered by the (assistant) Head Referee and/or the Technical Delegate.
- The number of people, as indicated below, may accompany sides into the Call Room:

BC1	1 Coach, plus 1 Sport Assistant
BC2	1 Coach
BC3	1 Coach, plus 1 Ramp Operator
BC4	1 Coach (plus 1 Sport Assistant if Athlete is a foot player)
Pairs BC3	1 Coach, plus 1 Ramp Operator per Athlete
Pairs BC4	1 Coach (plus 1 Sport Assistant if Athlete is a foot player)
Team (BC1-2)	1 Coach, plus 1 Sport Assistant

- Translators are not subject to this restriction. However, they may only enter the call room if asked to do so by the Referee. Chairs will be provided for Translators, outside of the Call Room and in a specific place on the field of play (FOP).

7. COMPETITION SCHEDULE

The final competition schedule will be made available after the Official Draw, at the **Technical Meeting, on the 4th August at 20h30**, and will be sent to Team Managers or designated people.
